- I. God's own special treasure (Deut. 7:6; 14:2; 26:18; Psa. 135:4; Matt. 13:44)
- II. A kingdom of priests and a holy nation (Exod. 19:6; Isa. 61:6; 1Pet. 2:5-9; Rev. 1:5-6; 5:9-10; 2:26-27; 3:21; 12:4-6; 20:4; Dan. 7:18, 22, 27; Psa. 149)
- *III.* A spiritual house built up with living stones with Christ as the Cornerstone
 - A. The house of the living God a holy temple in the Lord (1 Cor. 3:16-17; Psa. 93:5; Exo. 26:33)
 - B. How to conduct oneself in the house of God (2 Tim. 3:15)
 - To be holy as God is holy (1 Pet. 1:14-16) perfect as the Father is perfect
 - a. God's divine nature (2 Pet. 1:4)
 - b. He dwells in His holy mountain (Psa. 48:1)
 - c. He sits on His holy throne, reigning over the nations (Psa. 47:8)
 - d. His way is a "highway of holiness" (Isa. 35:8)
 - 2. The believers are called "saints" (1 Cor. 1:2)
 - a. Putting off the old man and putting on the new man (Eph. 4:22-24)
 - b. Pursuing peace and holiness (Heb. 12:10, 14).
 - c. Serving in holiness and righteousness (Luk. 1:74-75; Rom. 6:19b, 22)
 - d. Perfecting holiness in the fear of God (2 Cor. 7:1; 6:14-18)
 - 3. Christ desires to present to Himself a glorious church holy and without blemish (Eph. 5:25-27)
 - C. The daily sacrifice offered in the temple (Exo. 29:37-42; Num. 28:3-8)
 - The fire of the burnt offering altar should never go out (Lev. 6:9-12)
 - 2. Reminding the priests that the temple belongs to God and is for God

- 3. The Jews turned the temple into a den of thieves and a house of merchandise (Jer. 7:11; Mat. 21:13; Joh. 2:13-17)
- IV. A holy and royal priesthood
 - A. To offer up Christ as spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God the Father
 - B. To worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness (1 Chron. 16:29; Psa. 29:2; 96:9)
- V. The garments (Exo. 28) and the consecration of the priests (Exo. 29:1-34)
- VI. The true worship in the word of God the 7 feasts and the 7 offerings
 - A. The feasts are prepared by God in and through Christ for our enjoyment and experience
 - B. The offerings are prepared by us through our daily experience of Christ to offer up to God as His food (Num. 28:2)
 - C. The Lord's table
 - 1. The first part is for the remembering of the Lord with the partaking of the bread and the cup of blessing
 - 2. The second part is for the worship of the Father with the offerings brought by the saints
