I. Pursuing holiness (Heb. 12:14)

- A. Jesus Christ's second coming is near (1 Thess. 5:1-5)
 - 1. The feasts of the Lord
 - 2. The Feast of Tabernacles in October 2020 and the possible start of the last 7 years in Daniel 9:27
- B. So that we can see the Lord (Heb. 12:14; 2 Pet. 3:11)
 - Our body is a temple of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 6:19) – we are God's holy temple (1 Cor. 3:17; Eph. 2:21)
 - God wants to sanctify our body, soul, and spirit (1 Thess. 5:23; 2 Cor. 7:1), so that we can serve Him as holy priests (1 Pet. 2:5)
 - a. Body to do God's will (Rom. 8:11-13; 12:1; 1 Cor. 6:15; Heb. 10:5-7)
 - b. Soul (2 Tim. 1:7; Rom. 12:2; Phil. 2:12-13; 1 John 2:15-17; Col. 3:1-3)
 - c. Spirit (Rom. 9:1; Acts 23:1; 24:16; Heb. 9:14)
 - 3. The practical way to be sanctified to experience Christ as the reality of all the feasts and offerings (1 Pet. 2:5; Col. 2:16-17)
- C. To be useful for the Lord in these last days
 - Examples: Abraham (Gen. 12:1; 13:9-17; Acts 7:3), Moses (Heb. 11:24-26), Joshua (Exod. 33:11), Joseph (Gen. 39:7-23), Daniel (Dan. 1:8-9), Job (Job 31:1-2)

2. God does not need our capability but our sanctification (2 Tim. 2:21-22)

II. The holy nature of God's dwelling place – built up in love

(Exod. 26:29-30; 36:34; Col. 2:2)

- A. The sanctuary a picture of our soul (2 Tim. 1:7)
 - 1. Will (Phil. 2:12-13; Ps. 51:12)
 - 2. Emotion (1 John 2:15-17; Eph. 6:24; 1 Cor. 16:22)
 - 3. Mind (Eph. 4:17-24)
- B. The sanctuary is overlaid with gold God's love is the expression of the maturity in life (2 Pet. 1:5-7)
 - Acacia wood overlaid with gold: The perfect love of God manifested in the Man Jesus Christ (John 10:11-13; 13:1-17; 15:12-13; Rom. 5:8; 1 Cor. 13; Ps. 109:4-5; Eph. 5:25; Col. 3:12-14)
 - The expression of God's love (1 John 3:16-18; 1 Pet. 3:8-9; 4:8; Phil. 2:2-4; Rom. 12:9-21)
 - Paul's example (Acts 20:18-35; 1 Cor. 10:32-33; 2 Cor. 6:3-12; 11:2; 1 Thess. 2:5-12; John 10:12-13)
 - 4. The testimony of the church (John 13:34-35; 1 John 4:12; Rev. 2:4; 3:7)
- C. To pursue the reality in Christ to be perfected (2 Pet. 1:5-11; Eph. 5:1-2; Ps. 122:9; 133)
 - 1. We love because He first loved us (1 John 4:19; Rom. 5:5; John 15:9)
 - In shepherding and bearing with one another (John 21:15-17; Eph. 4:2, 16; Gal. 6:2; 1 Cor. 8:1; Heb. 10:24)
 - 3. Always progressing and not growing weary (2 Pet. 1:8, 10; 1 Cor. 15:58; Heb. 6:10-12; Gal. 6:9-10)

- III. The golden incense altar (Exod. 30:1-10, 34-38; Ps. 141:2; Rev. 5:8; 8:3-5)
 - A. The link between the Holy Place and Most Holy Place (Exod. 30:6, 36; Heb. 9:3-4)
 - B. The place of God's speaking (Exod. 25:22; 1 Kings 6:22; Ezek. 41:22; Luke 1:8-22)
 - C. Made of acacia wood overlaid with gold (Exod. 30:1-5) what manner of people we ought to be (Col. 3:12-14)
 - 1. Righteous (Luke 18:9-14; Prov. 15:29; James 5:16; Phil. 3:9)
 - Cleansed and sanctified (Isa. 1:15-18; Matt. 5:8; 1 Tim. 2:8; 2 Tim. 2:20-21 => Rev. 5:8)
 - 3. Gentle and lowly in heart (Matt. 11:29), full of love and mercy (Heb. 2:17; Rom. 15:1)
 - 4. Enduring (Exod. 30:7+; Isa. 62:6+; Luke 18:1; Col. 4:2)
 - D. The ministry of reconciliation (Exod. 30:10; 2 Cor. 5:18; Heb. 7:25; Num. 17:6-13; Dan. 9:3-19)
 - E. Examples for the service at the incense altar
 - 1. The Lord's prayer in the constitution of the heavenly kingdom (Matt. 6:5-15)
 - 2. The prayer of the church (Acts 4:23-31; Rev. 8:3-5)
 - 3. Paul's prayers (Eph. 1:15-23; 3:14-21; Phil. 1:3-11; Col. 1:3, 9-13; 2:1-3; 4:2-4)
- IV. The Day of Atonement in the new covenant coming forward with boldness into the Most Holy Place (Lev. 16; Heb. 10:19-25)
 - A. In the old covenant, the high priest could enter the Most Holy Place only once a year (Lev. 16:2, 34; Exod. 30:10; Heb. 9:7-8)

- B. In the new covenant, we can enter at any time (Heb. 4:16; 7:25; 10:19-22; 11:6; Eph. 2:18; Matt. 22:1-8) based on Christ's work
 - 1. The veil has been torn (Matt. 27:51; Mark 15:38; Gen. 3:8-9, 24; Luke 12:49-50)
 - With His own blood Christ entered the Most Holy Place of the heavenly sanctuary once for all (Heb. 9:11-12, 14, 24, 26; 10:10, 12)
 - 3. Christ as the High Priest is our Advocate with God the Father (Exod. 16:12-13; 1 John 2:1; Rom. 8:34; Heb. 12:24)
- C. Coming forward into the the Most Holy Place with boldness and in faith (Heb. 4:14-16; 10:22, 35-39; 11:6)
 - Humbling ourselves (Lev. 16:29-31; James 4:4-8; Prov. 16:18; Joel 2:13; Rev. 2:4-5; 3:20; Matt. 15:7-9) and turning our whole heart to the Lord (2 Cor. 3:15-17; 2 Chr. 16:9; Jer. 29:13; 1 Cor. 12:3)
 - Applying the blood to be forgiven and cleansed (1 John 1:7, 9; Mic. 7:19; Ps. 103:12; Heb. 8:12; Col. 3:13) and the Spirit to be washed from all death (Eph. 5:26-27; Ezek. 36:25)
 - 3. Putting off the old man and putting on Christ (Col. 3:9-12)
 - 4. Coming forward together (Eph. 2:18)
- D. The blessing of coming forward and remaining in the Most Holy Place (Exod. 33:11; Ps. 139:18)
 - 1. Saved from the deceitfulness of the world (Ps. 73:17) to behold the beauty of the Lord (Ps. 27:4-5)
 - 2. Being saved to the uttermost (Heb. 7:25)
 - 3. Having peace with God and with one another (Col. 3:15; Matt. 5:9)

- 4. Beholding and reflecting the glory of the Lord and being transformed into His image (2 Cor. 3:18; Exod. 34:29-35)
- Hearing God's voice and entering into an intimate relationship with Him (Exod. 25:22; 29:42-43; 33:9, 11; Heb. 8:11; Num. 12:8; Amos. 3:7; Gen. 18:17; James 2:23; Ps. 25:14; Song of Songs 1:4)

V. The mercy seat (propitiatory cover)

(Exod. 25:17-22; 37:6-9)

- A. To make atonement
 - 1. Our problem (Rom. 3:23)
 - a. We have sinned
 - b. We fall short of God's glory
 - 2. God's requirements
 - a. The righteous requirements of the law (Rom. 8:4)
 - b. The expression of His glory (Rom. 9:23; Eph. 1:12; 2 Thess. 2:14; Heb. 2:7, 10)
 - 3. Christ, our propitiation (Rom. 3:25)
 - a. By His blood, through faith (1 John 1:7-9; Exod. 12:13; Lev. 16:15-16)
 - b. Propitiation for our sins (1 John 2:2; 4:10)
 - c. The place where God meets us (Eph. 2:18)
- B. The throne of grace (Heb. 4:16)
 - 1. Its foundation is righteousness and justice (Ps. 89:14; 97:2)
 - 2. God's footstool (1 Chr. 28:2; Ps. 132:7)
 - God's dwelling place and the place where He speaks above the cherubim of glory (Exod. 25:22; 1 Sam. 4:4; 2 Sam. 6:2; Ps. 80:1; Ezek. 1:22-26; 9:3; Heb. 9:5)
 - 4. To obtain mercy and grace to help in time of need while it is called "Today" (Heb. 3:7, 13; 4:7)
 - 5. To behold and reflect the glory of the Lord and to be transformed (2 Cor. 3:18)

VI. The tablets of the Testimony

(Exod. 24:12; 25:21; 31:18; Deut. 5:1-22; 10:1-5; 2 Chr. 5:10)

- A. The law displays God's nature, holiness and glory (Exod. 20-23)
 - 1. It is perfect, sure, right und pure; holy, righteous und good (Ps. 12:6; 19:7-8; Rom. 7:12)
 - 2. God's testimony (Deut. 4:8; Rom. 3:20)
 - 3. Became flesh in Jesus Christ (John 1:14, 18; 14:7-9; Heb. 1:3; Ps. 40:7-8)
- B. God wants to put His law in our minds and write it on our hearts (Jer. 31:31-34; 2 Cor. 3:3; Ezek. 36:26-27; 1 Tim. 1:5; Rom. 3:31; Rev. 3:12; 1 Pet. 2:5)
 - 1. Love the LORD your God with all your heart (Deut. 6:5; Mark 12:30; Luke 7:44-47; Ps. 97:10; 1 John 2:3-6; 5:3)
 - Love your neighbor as yourself (Lev. 19 [v. 18]; Mark 12:31; Rom. 13:8-10; John 21:15-17; 1 John 2:7-11; 3:11-18; 4:7-5:2)
- C. In the law, we behold the glory of the Lord as in a mirror and are being transformed (2 Cor. 3:18; James 1:21-25)

VII. Aaron's rod that budded

(Num. 17:1-10; Heb. 9:4)

- A. Background God's answer to the rebellion of Korah and all his company and the complaints of the children of Israel (Num. 16:1-50)
- B. The rod (vv. 2-3) a sign of God's authority (see Exod. 4:17; 7:9-12, 19-20; 8:5-6, 16-17)

- C. The man whom God has chosen (v. 5) Christ, appointed by God as the King and the High Priest in Zion (Heb. 5:4-6; Ps. 2:6; 110:1-4; 1 Pet. 2:6-8)
- D. Aaron's rod that budded (v. 8) Christ, whose name is the "Branch" (Zech. 6:12-15; Isa. 4:2; 11:1-4; 53:2; Jer. 23:5; 33:15-18)
 - 1. He reigns with resurrection power and the fullness of life (Acts 17:31; Rom. 1:4; 14:9; Heb. 7:16)
 - He is the Good Shepherd to His sheep (Ps. 23; John 10; Heb. 13:20-21; 1 Pet. 2:25; 5:2-4; Rev. 7:17)
 - He will bring all who obey Him to maturity quickly <v. 8: "ripe almonds"> (Heb. 5:9)
 - 4. He will do a new thing (Isa. 43:18-19)
 - 5. All the glory of the church shall hang on Him (Isa. 22:24)
- E. As a sign against the rebels to put their complaints away from the Lord, lest they die (v. 10; 1 Cor. 10:10-11; John 6:43; Phil. 2:14; James 5:9; 1 Pet. 4:9)

VIII. The hidden manna (Rev. 2:17; Exod. 16; John 6:31-58)

- A. Manna, the bread from heaven in the wilderness (Exod. 16; Num. 11:4-9)
 - 1. Comes in the morning with the dew and melts when the sun becomes hot
 - 2. Small and round, white and fine as frost, like coriander seed, like the color of bdellium, tasting like wafers made with honey
 - 3. Used by the Lord to test His people
- B. Christ, the true manna (John 6:58)
 - 1. He who eats this bread will live forever
 - 2. God's word as our food (Deut. 8:3; Jer. 15:16)

- 3. A sign of maturity: exercised senses to discern the taste of the Lord (1 Pet. 2:3; Heb. 5:14)
- C. The hidden manna, a reward for the overcomers (Rev. 2:17)
 - 1. Hidden 5-fold (in the outer court, sanctuary, Most Holy Place, ark, and the golden pot)
 - 2. Special food for the priests in the presence of God

IX. The history of the ark and the tabernacle

- A. Wandering in the wilderness for 40 years
- B. Entering the good land (Josh. 3:6, 11, 17)
- C. The tabernacle and the ark at Shiloh (Josh. 18:1)
- D. The ark is separated from the tabernacle and is captured by the Philistines (1 Sam. 4; Ps. 78:58-61)
- E. The Philistines are struck with plagues because of the ark (1 Sam. 5)
- F. The ark is returned to Israel (1 Sam. 6)
 - 1. To Beth Shemesh
 - 2. In Kirjath Jearim (1 Sam. 7:1-2)
 - 3. David retrieves the ark from the house of Abinadab (2 Sam. 6:1-8)
 - 4. In the house of Obed-Edom (2 Sam. 6:9-11)
 - 5. David brings the ark to the City of David (2 Sam. 6:12-17; 1 Chr. 15)
 - 6. The tabernacle remains in Gibeon (1 Chr. 16:39)
 - David's desire to build the temple (2 Sam. 7:2; Ps. 132)
- G. Bringing the ark into the temple (1 Kings 8; 2 Chr. 5)
- H. The temple in Ezekiel

- 1. The glory of the Lord departs from the temple (Ezek. 10:18-19)
- 2. The glory of the Lord comes into the new temple (Ezek. 43:2-5)
